Double Decker Plant Hanger Finished size: approx. 44" long


Materials: 45 ½ yards total of cord in two colors cut as follows: 22 yards of color A and 22 yards of Color B, three pieces of cord each piece ½ yard long. One 1" brass ring

Instructions:


- Cut 4 cords each 5 ½ yards long in Color A and 4 cords each 5 ½ yards long in Color B. Slip the cords through the brass ring and center. You will now have 16 strands.
- 2. Cut one cord $\frac{1}{2}$ yard long and tie a Wrap Knot to hold cords in place.
- 3. Separate strands into 4 groups with 4 strands per group. Begin tying Half Knots using 4 strands as shown 2 of each color for approximately 6". Tie the last Half Knot tightly.
- 4. Drop down 4" and begin tying Alternating Square Knots. Drop down 4" and do another round of Alternating Square Knots.
- 5. Cut one strand ½ yard long of each Color A and Color B and finish with a Wrap Knot. Trim ends.
- Repeat Step 3 above except arrange the 4 strands 2 of each color so the 2 shorter strands are in the center of each group. Begin tying Half Knots for approximately 6". (Note: Use the longer strands of each color as Working Strands and the shorter strands as the center strands).
- 7. Drop down 4" and begin tying Alternating Square Knots. Drop down 4" and do another round of Alternating Square Knots.
- Cut one strand ½ yard long of each Color A and Color B and finish with a Wrap Knot. Trim ends.

NOTE: Five to Six wraps is approximately 1" of Knot.


Double-Decker Hanger - Cord Wrapping Technique
