

Rexlace Bracelets

Materials:

One 7 foot length piece of Rexlace
One 5mm plastic buckle
One charm or button
EZZZY JIG or project board

Instructions:


1. Fold the 7 foot piece of Rexlace in half and Lark's Head onto one side of the buckle. The fold goes down into the buckle. Hint: If using the EZZZY-Jig simply open the buckle and snap the appropriate buckle half into place. If using a project board simply pin or tape the buckle to hold in place.
2. Take each working strand up through the back of the same buckle and down through the loop. This fills in the buckle.
3. Add charm(s) to the two center strands.
4. Pass the two working strands through the second half of the buckle twice.
5. Begin tying Square Knots using the working ends around two center strands.
6. Center the silicone charm and continue tying Square Knots around the charm.
7. Finish by clipping each working strand at an angle to a length of approximately 6". On the backside of bracelet take the left working strand and begin weaving down into the loops on the left side one at a time. Continue for 4 – 5 loops then trim ends. Repeat on right side.

Hints:


1. For a tight weave push up your Square Knots as you knot.
2. Clip the ends at an angle for easier insertion.
3. If you forget which half of the Square Knot is next, look at your work, the side with the "loop" is the side that will begin the Square Knot.
4. Before knotting stretch the Rexlace slightly to allow the Rexlace to lay flat as you knot.

EZZzy-Jig Parachute Bracelet Maker™

Ezzz-Jig Parts:




To set up the Ezzz-Jig:



1. Use the wing nut and bolt adjustment to set the length for the completed bracelet.
2. Clip each half of the buckle to be used for the bracelet into the appropriate buckle half attached to the jig.
3. Follow the instructions for tying the Cobra Stitch.


Single Cobra Stitch Shown:



Single Color Bracelet

1. Measure and cut 1 length of Parachute Cord 8 feet long.
2. Fold the cord in half to find the center. Feed the center through the first half of the clip and pull the strands through the center as shown.
3. Feed the ends of the cord through the second half of the clip as shown. Slide the clip down the cord so that it's held 6.5" (small size) to 7.5" (large size) apart. Adjust to your wrist size as needed.
4. Follow the instructions for the Cobra Stitch. Make the last stitch Tight.
5. Trim remaining cord and fuse/melt the tips of the Parachute Cord to secure. Use a lighter to melt the ends*. See Fig. 2.

* Not intended for children. Adult Supervision is REQUIRED when working with an open flame!
